Colors: Turquoise, Purple, Navy Blue, Hunter Green, Red, Black and White.

Turquoise: One of the colors of my first association The Constellations. It symbolizes friendship, tranquility, joy and loyalty.

Association Pin:

A clan badge with the belt in Navy, purple and turquoise. The buckles are gold. Along the belt is the Association name and the year 2024. The crest within the badge is a field of hunter green with a Luckenbooth in gold and the Eastern Star emblem in the center. The Luckenbooth is a Scottish symbol of love and dates back to a love story between Mary Queen of Scots and the Dauphin of France in the 17th century. It is often given as a token of betrothal, affection and friendship. It is usually in the shape of a heart or two entwined hearts symbolizing love and with a crown to symbolize loyalty.
