I'm now going to share with you my special project. My special benevolent project for this year will be to help support the annual "Celebration of Life": A celebration for those who have been touched by cancer. It is a full day of celebration, education and kinship for the Beth Israel Deaconess cancer community. This annual event raises awareness of the battle against cancer, and welcomes all <u>women and men</u> who have been touched by this class of diseases. The event also welcomes those patients from other hospitals in and around Boston. Now in its 16th year,

Celebration of Life brings together patients and their friends and family members, along with physicians, nurses, social workers, and other cancer care providers at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center. This event allows people living with cancer an opportunity to share personal experiences, information about new treatments and support systems, and to learn from Harvard Medial School physicians and community experts and, of course, to learn from each other.

Each year, the Celebration of Life is held on National Cancer Survivors Day – an annual, worldwide day of symbolic unity for cancer survivors, their loved ones, and cancer care providers that is typically observed on the first Sunday in June, which this year is June 7th. It will include more than two-dozen workshops led by BI faculty and staff and other community experts. This event will also feature an extended lunchtime discussion with cancer survivors hosted by Kelley Tuthill from Channel 5, a breast cancer survivor. The day is chock full of workshops, music, art, and opportunities for participants to share their personal stories and includes breakfast, lunch, goodie bags, and so much more for the attendees.

This event relies solely on donations to continue. Since it is so important for cancer patients to receive all the information and assistance they can, I think this is a different and unusual way for us to be able to help them. I hope you will assist me in this endeavor. As I have seen the devastation of several different cancers take the lives of my family and friends, I was unable to choose just one particular cancer to support. So I decided to encompass all cancers, for both women and men. I'll bet every family in this auditorium has been touched by some sort of cancer. I feel this is an important service that they provide and the Order of the Eastern Star of Massachusetts will be proud to be able to assist with their patient's education and care.

Art and I will be sharing one pin this year, which will represent both of our special charities, and after he has spoken, I will be happy to describe it to you. The total proceeds received from the sale of this pin will be divided equally between each of our charities.
