History

The Newton Masonic Building was specifically built to be a location for Masonic organizations located in Newton. Two of those organizations, Dalhousie Lodae Gethsemane Commandery meeting nearby, managed to arrange the financing of the building's \$100,000 construction cost. In the early 1890s, they engaged the architectural firm of Hartwell, Richardson and Driver to design and build. The Richardson in this firm was not the famous architect Henry Hobson Richardson but was William Cummings Richardson who happened to be a member of both Dalhousie and Gethsemane.

Nevertheless, Hartwell, Richardson and Driver used the then popular Romanesque Revival style in designing the building, a style popularized by H. H. Richardson. They later built a new Classical Newton High School on Walnut Street (since demolished). Hartwell and Richardson (before Driver) had also built the Central Congregational Church on Walnut Street (now the Newton Campus of the Boston Chinese Evangelical Church), and many schools, banks and town halls across the state.

On Wednesday, September 23, 1896 the cornerstone was laid by Most Worshipful Edwin Bradford Holmes, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Masons in Massachusetts in traditional Masonic fashion. Merely a year later on October 6, 1897, Most Worshipful Charles Carroll Hutchinson, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Masons in Massachusetts came to dedicate the building and congratulate the Newton brethren on this accomplishment.

Today, the Newton Masonic Building is listed in the Massachusetts State Register of Historic Places and is a contributing property to the Newtonville Historic District recognized and listed in the National Register of Historic Places.
